Supply List for Serger 101 Class

Serger and owners Manuel showing stitch set up and threading instructions

Serger power cord and foot pedal (friendly reminder and very necessary)

Small screwdriver for changing needles (usually comes with the Serger)

4 spools of assorted color (contrast-ing thread works best for the lessons) thread vertically loaded (small cones)

Embroidery thread or similar for decorative stitches

Wooly nylon for rolled hem (optional but works best)

2 Regular serger needle plus (1 90/14 top stitch needle and decorative 40wt thread)

¼ inch ribbon 6 inches long (optional but fun)

Blind hem foot (optional)

Gathering foot (optional but helpful)

Scraps of fabric (no smaller than 3"x7")

Stretchy knits

Sheer

Silky

Cotton

Wool

2 cotton fat quarters colors you love (1 light solid color)

4x6 index cards at least 6

Pen or pencil

Small ruler

Tweezers (usually comes with a serger)

Brush with needle holder in the end (usually comes with a serger)

Chop sticks (very useful for guiding fabric close to cutting blade)

Clover clips or pins (clips are best as alternative for basting with thread)

Pins (not recommended unless they are place vertically parallel to the fabric edge) (sergers have a cutting blade that can be severely damaged by pins)

Needle and thread for hand stitching or basting (optional but helpful)

Thimble

Rotary cutter mat and ruler (optional but helpful)

Small iron, pressing pad and pressing cloth (optional but helpful)

Wooden clapper (optional but helpful for pin tucks)

Spray starch (optional but very helpful)

Fray Block (optional)

Nippers or small shears for cutting thread tails

Water soluble interfacing (optional)

Blunt Tapestry Needle
